This perception and understanding that the world we leave behind for our kids is being destroyed by us ourselves. Until no one stands up for it, our children will have to bear the bitter wrath of our wrongdoings.

Nature, the environment does not play any major role, but it is everything. On the contrary, the other beings play their roles. Sadly, human beings, known as the smartest, are hell-bent upon exploiting Nature.

When a seed is buried under the soil and watered, given a little attention, it grows into a majestic tree. Isn't that amusing itself? We do not see anyone working on that seed; we just watch it grow. Isn't it amusing that the life-saving oxygen that we breathe is emitted by Nature, her trees? This is enough reason to respect Nature and conserve her. The fact that Nature is "life-saving" is more than a reason for me to have that special place for her in my heart. Strangely, I was a topper in my dental school! I barely practiced for a couple of years before I started developing an interest in water conservation and overall sustainable living. I tried to manage both, but all my other interests such as traveling, shopping, partying started to die. As I learned more about the aspects of nature, I started to get pulled into it. I researched, read a lot, attended many training programs, and started working on living a chemical-free and natural life. I have spent all of my life till now in a small city called Belgaum, in Karnataka.

The climate crisis looks like a "madeup" topic of discussion, a reason to hold conferences and summits, and an excuse for influencers to make content. But trust me when I say that it's a nightmare on its way to turning into a reality. Most of us have a basic idea about the deteriorating weather and climate; not many of us want to dig into it and work for it, as we have no time for Nature. The fact that the smallest things work and not necessarily a herculean task is something that's not quite getting into our brains.

To see a world where every living being, every human gets access to clean and pure water. To live in a world without wearing a mask. But yes, in the end when I watch youngsters and kids, colleges and housing societies learn and implement what I teach, it gives me immense satisfaction. I learn to be selfless like Nature, not selfish. They say "neki kar dariya mein daal." That's precisely what I am doing.

More than turning into an ecoconscious woman, my work has made me realize the absolute importance of being grounded and humble, and how practicing gratitude is a must. It has also calmed me down as a person because I realized that I am smaller than a grain of sand against the hills, mountains, and the oceans that belong to Nature.
